Albert J. Busse

Albert J. Busse, aged 51 years and three months, who for 30 years was active with his father and brothers in operation of the Busse Blacksmith Shop here, died in Piqua Memorial hospital at 3:40 p. m. Saturday.

Mr. Busse, who had been ailing seven weeks, was active in his work up to about 10 days before his death, which was attributed to carcinoma of the abdomen. He was bedfast one week.

Solemn requiem high mass was intoned in St. Augustine's church at 10:30 a. m. Wednesday. Rev. Fr. Alexander Linscott was celebrant of the mass. Assisting him were the Rev. Frs. Joseph Busse and Anthony Migoni, deacon and subdeacon, respectively. Bearing the pall to its resting place in the church cemetery were Charles Conrad, Werner Wyse, Edward P. Schunk, Ben Steinmann, Joseph Westerheide and Frank Fleming.

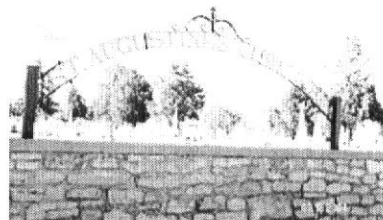
Mr. Busse, who left his studies in local schools to become identified in the business which brought to him a wide acquaintanceship throughout the section, was born here Feb. 15, 1895, son of Joseph and Elizabeth Schafer Busse. For a number of years he built wagons, then in late years did general blacksmith work. His reputation was that, if a horse was stubborn or fearful, he finished the job of taming the animal once he agreed to and started the job.

In 1916 the business with which he was identified changed color somewhat with formation of a partnership with John Burnington, and the addition of a farm equipment sales department. Clemons Dering is now associated in the part of the business, handling the interest of his father, now 86 and retired for several years.

Surviving are his father, who started the blacksmith business in 1890 and was active until five years ago, his widow, Pauline Baumer Busse, whom he married Sept. 17, 1938, and four brothers and two sisters: Edward, Charles, Robert and George Busse, and Mrs. Clara Fricott, Minster, and Mrs. Henry Donner, Dayton.

Mr. Busse was a member of the Holy Name and St. Augustine societies of the local parish, of which he was a lifetime member, and he received the last sacrament of the church. Fraternally, he was a member of the Minstererie, Fraternal Order of Eagles.

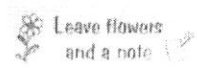
