**John Busse**

John Busse, who was a member of a prominent Minster family during a past period of time died at his home in Dayton, Ohio, on Thursday, March 9, 1935, and his body was interred in the Calvary cemetery in that city on Thursday morning.

As an active citizen of this city he was connected with the wagon maker's business and he followed that line of action for a number of years after he left this community.

He was a brother of Joseph Busse and Frank Busse, both well known residents in Minster and during his earlier life he was associated with both of these men in a business way. He left Minster and moved to Dayton during the year of 1904 and from that time on he maintained a residence in that city along with the members of his immediate family.

He was a son of Henry and Mary Decker Busse who both spent many years among the people of this community and passed away at advanced ages. He grew up during his young manhood among the ranks of the secular and religious training that had been provided for by local leaders. At an early age he entered a wagon maker shop that was owned and operated by his brother Frank Busse and after serving an apprenticeship in that institution he became a partner in an establishment that he carried on here.

A partnership was formed by himself and his brother Joseph Busse and they built wagons in a shop that stood at the site where the Garmon store is now located. This business furnished the wood work for the wagons was done by John Busse and the iron work was done by Joseph Busse, the latter a blacksmith. The business continued to have a place in Minster affairs until the time when John Busse moved to Dayton.

As a resident in the Gem City, Ohio, Busse was first connected with an establishment that was owned and operated by Adolph Heller, who was also a wagon builder. When he divorced himself from Heller institution he associated himself with his sons and they tried on over a period of eight years.

Mr. Busse and his sons had a shop on south Montgomery street in Dayton and they built heavy wagons there.

Henry Busse, who was the father of John Busse, was born in Egypt, Nile the mother was born in Cincinnati, Ohio. The father erected the building that offers accommodations to the machinery and offices of the Minster Woolen manufacturing company and he was interested in the manufacture of wool cloth for considerable time. His son John was attracted by her lines of vocation and entered a leather's wagon maker shop as an apprentice early in his life. John Busse was united in marriage to Anna Meyer at the St. Augustine church in Minster on the 11, 1887. This woman went with him when he moved to Dayton and maintained a place in the home as wife and mother until seven years ago when she passed away.

Nine children were born into the family and five of this number survive both the mother and father. They are all living in Dayton and they are: Mrs. Bernice Eganman, Henry Busse, Mrs. Josephine Gayler, Herbert Busse, Frank Busse. Two children died in infancy while two others lived to maturity before passing. There are thirteen living grand children and two great grand children.

Residing the brothers Joseph and Frank Busse who reside in Minster there is one other brother, Louis W. Busse at Ft. Loraine, Vanderhorst at Dayton. His father and his mother were the parents of ten children.

Mr. Busse was born on June 29, 1867, and at the time of his death was aged 67 years, 8 months and 10 days.


When he resided in Minster he became a member of the St. Francis Benevolent society and he always retained that membership. He was capped with the members of the Holy Rosary church in Dayton and the funeral was held at this church at nine o'clock on Thursday morning.
