LOUIS W. BUSSE

Requiem High Mass was sung in St. Michael's Church in Fort Loramie Tuesday at 9 a. m. for Louis W. Busse, aged 76, who died at 3 a. m. Friday in Piqua Memorial Hospital from effects of a cerebral hemorrhage. The Rev. Paul J. Rattermann officiated and burial was made in the church cemetery.

Mr. Busse, a widely-known Fort Loramie businessman, suffered the fatal seizure Wednesday at his residence. He had been in failing health for several years.

A native of Minster, he was born May 8, 1881. His parents were Henry and Mary Decker Busse. He and Cecilia Dwenger were married in 1904. She survives along with three sons, four daughters, 17 grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren.

The sons are Ludwig, Bernard and Alvin Busse, all of Fort Loramie, who have for many years been associated with the father in operation of the firm of L. W. Busse & Sons, wholesale and retail meat processors.

The daughters are Mrs. Elmer (Verlina) Reser, Sidney; Mrs. Francis (Lucille) King, Fort Loramie; Mrs. Donald (Marian) Parke, Sidney; and Mrs. Leonard (Betty) Jones, Piqua.

As a young man Mr. Busse was employed by his brother, Frank, in the Busse Meat Market in Minster, up to 1919 when he located in Fort Loramie and started his own business.

He was a member of the St. Joseph Society of the church and held membership in the Minster Eagles' Lodge.
