

He was born January 28, 1944, in Fort Loramie, Ohio, to Urban and Helen (Winner) Bornhorst. Tom is survived by his wife of 46 years, Margaret (Weems) Bornhorst. Tom and Margaret were married on August 5, 1967, at St. Juliana Catholic Church in West Palm Beach, FL. Tom concluded his scholastic studies at Florida Atlantic University where he earned his master's degree in education. He had been a school administrator, math teacher, and athletic coach in the Palm Beach County area for the greater part of his career, finally retiring in 2007. Family, Church, and community were very important to Tom. He loved fishing and camping with family and friends. He regularly attended St. Michael Catholic Church and was a member of the Fort Loramie Community Service Club. Reflecting his kind nature, Tom was affectionately known as a "gentle giant".
