

### Lena Philipot Funeral Conducted At Russia

Funeral services were held Thursday morning in St. Remy's church at Russia, Rev. Fr. Frank Raterman officiating, for Mrs. Lena Philipot, 51, who died in her residence near that village shortly before 7 a. m. Monday. Burial was made in the church cemetery.

Mrs. Philipot, who had been ill two years with complications, was born April 10, 1895, at Russia. She married Henry Philipot Feb. 17, 1914. He survives with these children: Joseph Philipot, Russia; Miss Mildred, at home; Mrs. Robert Edwards and Mrs. Henry Schlater, Ft. Laramie; Charles Philipot, St. Marys; Miss Eileen, at home; Leon, at Aberdeen, Md., with the Army, and Edwin, Ernest, Miss Pauline, Francis and Eugene, at home. Five children are dead.

Brothers and sisters are Henry A. and Edward Francis, Mrs. Elizabeth Goubeaux, Mrs. Bernadette Goubeaux and Louis H. Francis, Russia, and Mrs. Veronica Monnin, Covington. There are 14 grandchildren.

Leo, a twin brother, died when serving in World War I in 1918. Her mother, Adeline, died June 10, 1939, and her father, Louis F., June 12, 1944.

She was a member of the St. Ann society of the St. Remy church.
