Mrs. Moorman

Mrs. Johanna Moorman, 78, of 130 South Main street, Minster, widow of Frank Moorman, died at 1:30 a.m. Saturday in Joint Township Memorial Hospital, St. Marys.

Mrs. Moorman was hospitalized for 10 days with a coronary condition.

A native of Damma, Germany, she was born May 20, 1888, a daughter of Fred and Elizabeth Kohr Luebke, who moved to Minster when she was a child.

She was married Aug. 29, 1907. Her husband was a former superintendent of Maria Stein School. He died in 1942.

Survivors are four daughters, Mrs. Norbert (Freda) Gudorf of Minster, Mrs. Gar (Sally) Redick and Mrs. Allan (Jane) Ahlers, both of Dayton, and Mrs. Alvin (Dorothy) Niese of Wapakoneta; six sons, Rev. Gregory Moorman of Whiting, Ind., Richard, Paul Eugene, Virgil and David, all of Minster.

There are 61 grandchildren and 24 great-grandchildren; three sisters, Mrs. Henry (Anna) Brockman of Osgood, Mrs. Lawrence (Elizabeth) Lochtefeld of Chickasaw and Mrs. Catherine Walterbush of Coldwater; a brother, Fred Luebke of Maria Stein.

Two daughters, three sons, two brothers and three sisters preceded her in death.

Mrs. Moorman was a member of St. Augustine Church and St. Monica Ladies Sodality.

Her son, Rev. Gregory Moorman, offered a requiem mass at the church at 9 a.m. Tuesday. Two grandsons, Rev. Donald and Rev. Ronald Moorman served as deacons. Burial was made in the church cemetery.
