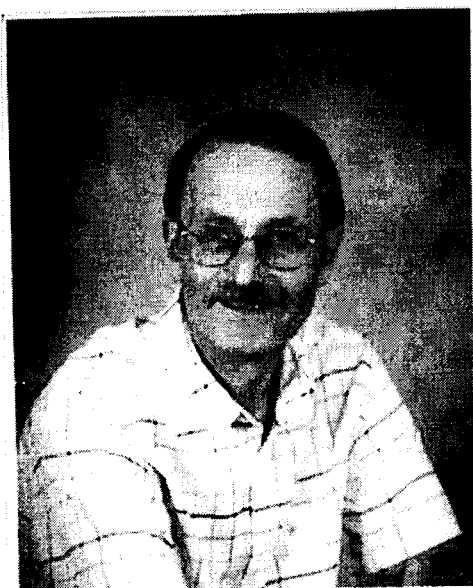

He was a past owner of the former Tasty Scoop Ice cream and Putt-Putt Course in New Bremen. Bill worked at the Midmark Corporation of Versailles, where he retired in July of 2011 after 40 years of service. Bill enjoyed hunting, driving around, and playing his guitar and was an original member of the "Philipot 4".
