## Airman Pleiman Rites Held Mon.

A requiem high mass for A-1-C James Edward Pleiman, 22, lost in action off the coast of North Viet Nam, was held at 9:30 a.m. Monday in St. Remy Church at Russia. Official confirmation of the young airman's death was received by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. August (La Vera Voisard) Pleiman, R. R. 1, Russia, on Thursday. He had previously been reported missing in action on March 15.

Pleiman was one of two airmen lost when their Air Force HU-16 Albatross amphibian was struck by mortar fire while attempting to rescue the two-man crew of a Phantom F4C, struck hy conventional ground fire. The plane's crew had bailed out to the sea two miles off the coast.
