Eugene B. "Gene" Pleiman, age 80, of Russia Ohio died Friday, September 21, 2012 at 5:14 PM at Wilson Memorial Hospital. He was the Vice-President of Sales and Engineering with Mansfield Brass and Aluminum Corp. a foundry in Mansfield. Gene was an avid fisherman, serving as co-captain, with his best buddy Hal Dodway on Hal's charter boat "Viking", out of Port Clinton on Lake Erie during the 1980's.
