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Minster Woman Died At Piqua Friday, July 3

The Body Was Brought
To Minster For The
Final Rites

AT THE LOCAL CHURCH

Mrs. Wilhelmina Zumbroge,
Wife Of Henry Zumbroge,
Piqua, Passed Away

Mrs. Wilhelmina Zumbroge died at Piqua on Friday morning of last week and her remains were brought to Minster, which was her home during the greater part of her life. On Sunday morning the funeral services were held at the St. Augustine church and at the conclusion of the rites interment was made in the local cemetery. For many years she resided on south Cleveland street with her husband and other members of her family and was making only a temporary stay in Piqua when her death occurred on July 3.

The deceased woman was the wife of Henry Zumbroge and the couple came to this city to make their home approximately thirty years ago. They moved to Minster from Ft. Loramie only a few years following their marriage and they had diverse connections with the affairs here when they established themselves among local people. The husband survives as do also their children, seven grand children and many other more distant kinmen, some of whom are living in this section of the country.

Mrs. Zumbroge succumbed at the age of 64 years, 10 months and 12 days and she was the last member of a family of several children to pass over the dividing line. Since her death the only surviving person who was directly connected with her family, besides her husband, is a brother-in-law, August Bruken, now living at Newark, Ohio.

She was born at Ft. Loramie on August 21, 1871, and was a daughter of Joseph and Mary Berline who were both natives of Germany. They both came to this country in their younger years and were united in marriage some time following their arrival here. They spent some time in Cincinnati but located in Ft. Loramie in the early history of their marital life.

She was united in marriage to Mr. Zumbroge in Ft. Loramie on April 18, 1888, and they established their home in that village soon after their wedding day. Their stay in Ft. Loramie was for only a few years, however, for of the forty-eight years of their wedded life forty years of that time were spent as residents in Minster.

The deceased became the mother of seven children and one of those persons, who was a two-year-old son, preceded her in death.

The surviving children are: Mrs. Marie Meyer, Cetus Zumbroge at Minster; John Zumbroge at Sidney; Mrs. Emma Jacomet at Piqua; Edward Zumbroge at Ann Arbor, Michigan; Mrs. Anna Baumgardner at Celina.

Mrs. Zumbroge began to decline in health during the month of January, of this year, and the process was gradual. A few weeks ago she was taken to the hospital at Piqua for treatment and her death occurred after she was removed from that institution to the home of her daughter, 229 Weber street.

On Monday the funeral Mass was read by Rev. Francis Bohner, C. P. S., of the St. Augustine parish.
