LOST BY CLOSE SCORE

To The I. C. H. S. Athletics In A Game Played At Celina

The Varsity basket ball team out of the Minster high school got a thumping at Celina on Friday night of last week in a nip and tuck battle with the team out of the I. C. H. S. of that city. The scoreman for the Minster team noted that there was an element of courage and snap all the way through the game and he feels that the winning team was not much better than the losing quintet in this match. He says that, man for man, there was a marked equality as to height and weight while both teams played with about the same speed and generalship.

For the Minster team Huelsman put on the best show as a score getter, while Boecker was also inclined to do things that count in this old game of basket ball. For Celina Fischer put on a one-man-show when he made one-half of the points credited to his team. The Minster team started to go places during the first half but they slowed down during the latter part of the game and finally allowed the Celinians to pass by them. A writer for the Celina Daily Standard made comments on the game as follows:

"The Blue and Gold members of the I. C. H. S. opened their 1937-38 basketball season at the local gym Friday night with a win over the fast Black and Orange team of Minster Hi by a close score of 20-16.

"With the elimination of the center jump, the game started out very fast with Minster starting the scoring and it was late in the first period when the Spartans collected a free throw to trail at the end of the period 6-1.

"As the second period opened the Celina offense started clicking and with Fischer sinking three long shots in a row, put the Spartans out in front. But not for long, as Minster came right back in the lead, but it didn't do any damage as the Spartans tied the score at 12-12 as the quarter ended.

"The last half saw both teams fighting for possession of the ball, but the Spartans, after once getting into the lead, were never overtaken, although Minster crawled within three points of them in the middle of the last quarter. With but a few seconds left to play, DeCurtin sank a free throw to give the Celina team a safe lead as time ended the game before another play could be gotten under way.
