



Frank H. Buschman

In the death of Mr. Frank H. Buschman there passed from off the stage of community action a man who spent his entire life among the people who have employed their time and their labor at the their time and their labor at the task of developing this locality to a state of high excellency. It is a noteworthy fact that the four score years of his life were lived within the confines of this immediate territory and that what he done with his hands and planned with his brain was actuated primarily by a numose to give service arily by a purpose to give service to those who lived round and about him.

The death of Mr. Buschman oc-The death of Mr. Buschman oc-curred on Tuesday, February 20, 1923, and it followed an illness of perhaps five weeks. He became a grippe patient at the time when this disease began to trouble the people, but did not show symptoms that were alarming until about one week prior to his passing away. Like all people who have attained to such an unusual age he was no to such an unusual age he was no longer fortified with a robust physique and was rather an easy victim for the malady. He stood the strain with striking courage until about the date of February 14 when he retired to a sick man's chamber, from which he never emerged alive. to such an unusual age he was no

Mr. Buschman was a familiar character among the people of this character among the people of this locality for a greater length of time than is the history of the average man. He was born in Shelby county, Ohio, of farmer parents and he followed in their way after he grew to manhood. As to his life's work there are no particularly

outstanding achievements and the character of the man is best pictured by noting that he took that place in life which he thought he was best qualified to fill and labored along daily, having not the least concern about the applicates of the world nor whether he was accomplishing more or less than the worker by his side.

He was married during the

He was married during the month of May, 1868, to Miss Mary Hoying and there are eight living children from this union: Four sons, Joseph, Henry, and Ferd at the home and William, Minster; four daughter, Rose and Gertrude Buschman at the home, Elizabeth Stucces at Minster; and Mary Staces Stueve at Minster and Mary Stueve at Osgond. There are also ten grandchildren and twelve great grandchildren. Sons-in-haw Ber-turd and Charles Stueve; daughterin-law Nora Buschman.

Following in the line of a farmer Mr. Buschman met with a reasonar. Buselman met with a reasonable portion of success and at the time of his death was the owner of a country home three-fourths of a mile south of Minster. It was at this place where he spent a great portion of his life and his death also occurred there.

He was a week history with the

also occurred there.

He was a worshipper with the members of St. Augustine parish in Minster for many generations and also held membership in St. Augustine Orphans society.

The funeral was held on Thursday morning at St. Augustine church and the body was interred in the local cemetery.

The deceased was aged \$1 years, 10 months and 20 days.
