Buschman there passed from off the stage of community action a man who spent his entire life among the people who have employed their time and their labor at the task of developing this locality to a state of high civilization. It is a noteworthy fact that the last score years of his life were lived within the confines of this insouciant territory and that what he deemed with his hands and plowed with his brain was actuated primarily by a purpose to give service to those who lived round and about him.

The death of Mr. Buschman occurred on Tuesday, February 20, 1923, and it followed an illness of perhaps five weeks. He became a gripe patient at the time when this disease began to trouble the people, but did not show symptoms that were alarming until about one week prior to his passing away. Like all people who have attained to such an unusual age he was no longer afflicted with a robust physique and was rather an easy victim for the malady. He stood the strain with striking courage until about the date of February 14 when he retired to a sick man's chamber, from which he never emerged alive.

Mr. Buschman was a familiar character among the people of this locality for a greater length of time than is the history of the average man. He was born in Shelby county, Ohio, of farmer parents and he followed in their way after he grew to manhood. As to his life's work there are no particularly

outstanding achievements and the character of the man is best pictured by noting that he took that place in life which he thought he was best qualified to fill and labored along daily, having not the least concern about the applause of the world nor whether he was accomplishing more or less than the worker by his side.
