Frank J. Busse

At noon on Wednesday, December 11, 1935, death removed from the local entrepreneur one who had a varied experience in commercial affairs here over the period of his life. After an illness of several years Frank Joseph Busse passed at his home on west Fourth street, leaving a wife and nine children to contemplate on a career that embraced many triumphs and some reverses. He was one of the business men in which he engaged during a lapse of nearly one-half a century. He was a familiar figure to almost every person in the community and the tidings that carried the news of his death created many expressions of regret.

He was born in Minster and when he became a young man he attached himself to commercial enterprises that contributed to the best interests of the town and community and until his health failed him, some three years ago, he was still in the midst of business activities. From the time when he began his life's career until he resided in Minster he was identified with a wagon maker, his wife, his son, his wife as a wagon maker, a butcher and certain other vocations that had place in the village's affairs.

He gave for short periods when he lived in Kansas City, Kansas, and at St. John, Mercer county, Ohio. He spent his days as a resident in Minster and he was a busy man, especially in the wagon making business. As a wagon maker he was considered very highly with his brothers and his brother and a stock buyer he was associated with two sons. In prosecuting his business plan he showed an element of courage that arose in the average person and no one was very largely aware of his outstanding character.

Mr. Busse was a son of Henry Busse and Mary Decker Busse and he was born on August 2, 1862. He lived to the age of nearly thirty years and in his first lady, that passed into the eternal sleep this December day, long illness had taken much of life's interests out of his constitution and since he had rendered mankind a good service his passing was powerful.

The father of Frank Busse enjoyed his energies and contractor like life for many days but in his later life he started a wooden mill in Minster and erected the building that stands on the south side of west Fourth street and is now property of the Minister Woods Manufacturing company. His wife has been dead during many years and now only two sons

and one daughter survive, brothers and sisters of the deceased Frank Busse. These are Joseph Busse at Minster; Louis Busse at Ft. Loramie; Mrs. Elizabeth Vanderhorst of Dayton.

In referring to his affairs during early life Mr. Busse always told his friends that he began his career as a wagon maker after learning the trade from late Rudolph Ogle. After he had been unsuccess-fully commissioned a master of the trade he was associated with various firms and companies as time passed, but finally he laid aside this business to conduct a meat market and stock buying enterprise.


As a wagon maker he first went to St. John, in Mercer county, and formed a partnership with Joseph Decker. This business relationship maintained itself approximately two and one-half years and at the end of that period he returned to Minster and entered a partnership with his brother, Joseph Busse, who was a blacksmith. He was also associated with a brother, John Busse, at a certain time in his life.

His kinmen remember that he went to Kansas City, Kansas, in his early life and literature in the hands of the family show that he was a member of the town. Busse Jones, carriage and wagon makers and blacksmiths in that city. His trip to the west was made very largely because of a decline in his health and he seemed to have been benefited.


When he returned to Ohio he accepted a position with a slack wire factory that was operating in Minster and it was while he was thus employed that he was severely injured when a boiler exploded in the plant. It was at about this time when he decided to engage in the meat market business, which he conducted over a period of 35 years.

Mr. Busse was united in marriage to Miss Josephine Ortman on October 23, 1889, and this woman survives, as do the following sons and daughters: Andrew Busse at Cincinnati; Mrs. Frances Murphy, Mrs. Eleanor Pett, Mrs. Estella Busse, Dayton; Mrs. Estella Busse, Dayton; Mrs. Loretta Frericks, John Busse at Minster. There are seven grand children.

The funeral will take place at the St. Augustine church in Minster on next Saturday morning at 9:00 o'clock. Rev. Fr. Vitus Bedette, C.P.P.S. pastor, in charge.
