MINSTER, May 1 - Funeral services were conducted Monday morning in St. Augustine Catholic church for Mrs. Frances Dorsten Wilke, 85, widow of William Wilke, who died in her home here after a long illness. Rev. Theodore Koenn intoned a requiem high Mass and burial followed in the church cemetery.

A native of Chickasaw, Mercer-co, she was born Feb. 4, 1859, a daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. August Dorsten. She married William Wilke as a young woman and he died July 8, 1904. Surviving are two sons, August and Dietrich Wilke of Minster; two daughters, Mrs. Johanna Kohler of Wapakoneta and Mrs. Ursula Slattery of LaSalle, Mich., and a brother, Joseph Dorsten of Coldwater.

She was a member of the St. Monica Married Ladies' society of the St. Augustine church.

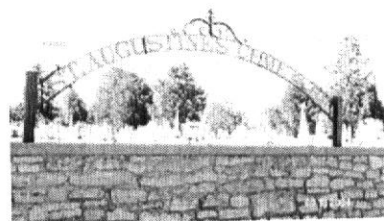
