# Mary Sommer

Death struck unexpectedly in the home of one of Fort Loramio's best-known families Tuesday evening and claimed the life of Mary Sommer, aged 62 years and five months, the wife of Henry Sommer, after an illness of but a few moments.

Mrs. Sommer, enjoying her usual good health, was busy with her work about the house at 5 p. m. when suddenly she complained to her husband of not feeling well and seated herself in a chair to rest. She succumbed within a few moments to coronary thrombosis.

Funeral services have been arranged for 10 n. m. Saturday in St. Michael's Catholic church here. Rev. Authony Moeller, the pastor, will intone the requiem high mass. Interment will follow in the church borial ground.

A lifelong resident of this community, Mrs. Sommer was born Mny 27, 1881, a daughter of the late George and Theresa Bauer Fleakenstein. She was married to Henry Sommer on June 5, 1901. For a number of years she resided with her family on their farm, one mile north of Fort Loramie along State Reute 66, now operated by a sun, Aloysius. They came to Fort Loramie to live 14 years ago.

Surviving are the husband and the following son and six daughters: Aloys Sommer, Ft. Loramie; Mrs. Irena Siegel, Newport; Mrs. Alfrieda Siegel, Pt. Loramie; Mrs. Clara Fader, Dayton; Mrs. Wilhelmine Maier and Mrs. Florence Barborst, Ft. Loramie; Mrs. Mary M. Brueken, Neesho, Mo. There are 23 grandchildren.

The following six sisters, all residing in and near Fort Loramic, are left: Mrs. Clara Rottinghaus, Mrs. Cecain Sommer, Mrs. Elizabeth Hoelscher, Mrs. Frances Sherman, Miss Eleonora Fleckenstein and Mrs. August Bornhorst. A sister and a brother preceded her in death.

A lifelong member of the Catholic church, Mrs. Sommer was a faithful member of the St. Michael parish here. She was a member of the St. Ann sodality and of the Catholic Ladies of Columbia.
