Henry A. Frierott, lifelong Minster citizen, who was prominently identified with the industry of this community for many years, was slain at his home at 111 South 5th street, last Saturday at 10 p. m.

Mr. Frierott, who at the time of his death was vice president of the Wooden Shoe Brewing Co., one of Minster's foremost enterprises, died peacefully at the age of 50. He had attained the age of 50 years, 11 months and 22 days.

Complications, with which he had suffered for the past year, and the death of Mr. Frierott, was bedfast for four months prior to his passing, and on several occasions was a patient in Memorial hospital at Piquette, where blood transfusions were administered in an unavailing effort to prevent the inevitable.

Born at the Frierott home on South Main street on Aug. 17, 1890, he was a son of late Bernard and Anna (Knapke) Frierott, prominent 30-day residents of Minster. His marriage to Miss Clara G. Busse took place on Nov. 18, 1912. Mrs. Frierott and one son, Elmer, are left to mourn the loss of a kind and loving husband and father.

Surviving also are the following brothers and sisters: Mrs. Lillian Bernhardt, A. W. Frierott, Frank Frierott, Miss Nora Frierott, Miss Alvina Frierott and Mrs. Herman Laut. A sister, Mrs. Frances Sommer, died July 14, 1940, and a brother, Elmer, was slain on Jan. 1, 1940.

Mr. Frierott was connected with the Minster brewery during most of his life. In addition to taking membership on the board of directors of the firm and his office of vice president, he was manager of the bottling department of the brewery plant.

A life-long member of the Catholic church, he was also a life-long parishioner of the St. Augustine congregation here and received the comfort of the last sacrament of the church before death occurred.

In connection with his church service Mr. Frierott held membership in the Holy Name society and the St. Augustine Orphan society of the local parish.

Fraternally he was a member of the Minster society of Eagles. He was a member also of the Minster Commercial club.

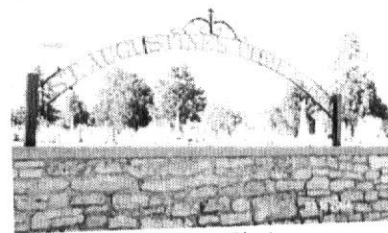
Funeral services were conducted in the St. Augustine church Wednesday at 9:30 a. m. by Rev. Theodore Kocan, pastor of the local parish, was celebrant of the solemn requiem mass.

The Rev. Cyril Kross of Minster was deacon, and the Rev. Edward Walser of Maria Stein was subdeacon.

The pallbearers were Wilfred Herkenhoff, Carl F. Ebling, Charles Adams, Karl Knoch, Oscar Knottman and Lawrence Wisniewski. Honorary pallbearers were Joseph Brudeman, M. F. Hartman, F. B. Fanning, Henry Oding, John Kemper, Horace Bins, Elmer Dulle, Harry Crawford, John Reed and Charles Kitzmiller.

Interment was made in the St. Augustine cemetery.
