Fort Loramie GI Killed In Vietnam

FORT LORAMIE — Pfc Jerome R. Frilling, 20, of Rt. 6 Sidney, was killed Sept. 30 in Chu Lai Province, Vietnam. Details of his death were not disclosed by the Defense Department.

Born Aug. 24, 1950, he was the son of Raymond and Agnes Meritz Frilling, who both survive.

Also surviving are two sisters, Mrs. Joseph (Margene) Opperman of Dayton and Mrs. Michael (Eileen) Albers of Bryan; and a brother, Roger of Dayton.

A member of the Miracle Division, 198th Infantry, he was a 1968 graduate of Fort Loramie High School. He was a member of St. Michael's Church, Fort Loramie, and the Apostleship of Prayer of the church. He was a student at Wright State University and employee of Stollie Corp., Sidney. He entered the Army Feb. 9, received his basic training at Ft. Leonard Wood, Mo., APT at Ft. Knox and was sent to Vietnam from Ft. Lewis, Wash., about July 28.
