

For a number of years Mr. Heckman operated as a carpenter among the people of this locality and there are specimens of his handiwork to be observed at many sites throughout the territory. H served as an apprentice under Mr.
Herman Schlachty who was a
builder here during an earlier period. He carried on his trade under diverso relationships until a later day when he engaged himself to The Rabe Lumber company with headquarters at New Bremen. He worked for this company over a period of fifteen years.
