A lifelong farmer in Putnam County, in 1972, Hendrich -- along with professor of mathematics Clinton Gass and DePauw chaplain Marvin Swanson, created the Winter Term in Mission, as it was first known. Originally sponsored by the United Methodist Committee for Overseas Relief, projects typically consisted of some construction and medical work and included DePauw students. The program continues to this day.

Hendrich also served his country in the Army Air Corps during World War II.
