Man Is Victim Of Collision At Cridersville

Linia district traffic accidents claimed the lives of three persons since 4 p. m. Friday.

The dead are: Leo Egbert Hierholzer, 52, of 226 E. Wayne-st, Celina; Conrad Gillig, 32, of Celina; and Frank Mann, 54, a Cridersville WPA laborer.

Hierholzer died as the result of a truck-auto crash near Cridersville in Route 25 at 2:36 a. m. Saturday. Mann died at 4:15 p. m. Friday in Memorial hospital from injuries sustained in a two-car collision four miles north of Wapak-

neta last Wednesday afternoon; and Gillig died from injuries suffered when he was struck by a car while walking across a Celina street at 8 p. m. Friday.

Meanwhile Dr. H. O. Crosby, Hancock-co coroner, returned a verdict of accident in the burning to death of James Anderson, 22, of Celina, when his truck crashed into a concrete bridge outside the southwest city limits of Findlay Friday.

With the death of Hierholzer the Auglaize-co traffic fatality toll for the year was boosted to nine; four in the last month. According to Coroner Alfred Veit this is the highest for a year since 11 were killed in 1932.

Hierholzer suffered a fractured skull and broken arms and legs. State Highway Patrolmen J. L. Bishop and W. C. Corder and Auglaize-co sheriffs deputies were told that the car driven by Hierholzer and a ton truck operated by Paul Fisher, 23, of Fort Jennings, sideswiped. Both vehicles were badly damaged.

It was reported that the victim was going south, apparently en-route home, while Fisher was going north. The truck was loaded with empty tomatoe crates.

Fisher was not injured. The body

of Hierholzer has been removed to a Celina funeral home from the Umbaugh and Bayliff mortuary.

Gilling died in the Otis hospital at Celina late Friday from a fractured skull and internal injuries received when he was struck by a car at Main and Anthony-sts in Celina about 8 p. m.

Mercer-co authorities were told that the driver of the automobile was Robert Vanderhorst, 19, of Celina. According to officers, Gilling was enroute to his home from a church service.

Mann died at 4:15 p. m. Friday in Memorial hospital of a head injury suffered Wednesday afternoon when the car he was driving was in collision with a vehicle operated by A. F. Smith, president of the Lithlay Corp. of Wapakoneta. The accident happened four miles north of Wapakoneta in State Route 501.

Officers were told that high corn obstructed the view of the drivers. Mann was unconscious practically all the time since the accident, hospital attaches reported.

Auglaize-co deputies were told that Smith was traveling north on the state route while Mann was on a county road.

Smith escaped injury.

Surviving Hierholzer, who was a salesman for the Marsh Tile Co., are his wife, Agnes; three sons, Charles, of Peru, Ind.; John and Thomas, both of Celina; a daughter, Martha, at home; his mother, Mrs. C. D. Hierholzer; two brothers, E. J. and A. M. Hierholzer, all of Celina; and two sisters, Miss Bertha Hierholzer of Celina, and Mrs. Olga Daniels of Tiffin.

Funeral services for Mann, who is survived by only his mother, Mrs. Alice Hawkins, with whom he resided, will be held at 2 p. m. Mon-
