Farmer In Fort Loramie Community Died Jan. 25

Anton Hilgefert Passed Away
After An Illness Of
Two Years

The death of Anton Hilgefert occurred at his farm home on Thursday, January 25, 1934, and the funeral and interment took place on Monday of this week.

Mr. Hilgefert had been a well known resident of the Ft. Loramie community during many years of time and his death removed a member of an influential circle of people. He was born at Ft. Loramie on August 14, 1870, and he lived continuously among the people in that locality during his allotted time. He was a farmer by vocation and spent many years at a place three miles south west of the village. He passed away at this farm home at the age of 63 years, 5 months and 11 days.

The deceased was a son of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Hilgefert who lived among a past generation of people in the Ft. Loramie community. They have both been dead for a number of years but among the present circle of citizens in Ohio there are living the following members of their family, who are sisters and brother of the subject of these paragraphs: Fred Hilgefert and Mrs. Matt Bracken at Ft. Loramie; Mrs. Clem Seger at Springfield; Mrs. Ben Bruns at Osgood.

Mr. Hilgefert absorbed the religious and secular training that was given to the youth of his day and came up to the age of young manhood quite well prepared to live a useful life and help to make civic plans. He was received into membership of the St. Michael Catholic congregation at the proper age and kept inviolate the obligations enjoined upon him all down through his life.

On January 25, 1899, he was united in marriage to Antoinette Puthoff and it was a coincidence that this union should be broken by death just thirty-five years later to the day.

Mrs. Hilgefert survives her husband as also do the following sons and daughters: Mrs. Louise Hoelscher living east of Ft. Loramie; Mrs. Harry Wendelin, Henry, William, Mathias, Edwin, Gilbert and Leona Hilgefert. There are twenty living grand children.

Edward, Mathias and Leona Hilgefert have lived at the home of their mother and father.

Mr. Hilgefert had been ill for two years with complications and his death was not unexpected.

The deceased was affiliated with the St. Joseph society of the Ft. Loramie parish and his brothers gave due recognition to his passing. The funeral mass was intoned by Rev. Anthony Moeller and the body was buried in the St. Michael cemetery.
