

He had been in declining health for a period of three years and had been compelled to make many changes in his vocational affairs because of the condition of his body. Eight weeks ago he gave up the position that he had been filling and country a complete according filling and sought a complete rest as a means of regaining his strength but he failed to get the relief that

was hoped for.
He suffered with diabetes and as time passed along other compli-cations overcame him until at last he stood to wage a losing fight.

Mr. Knostman was born in Minster and he spent his whole life in this city. He was connected with various local business enterprises during the days of his strength and was chosen by the people to a public position because they had confidence in him. At the election in the fall of 1925 he was elected as a member of the village council and he served on that board over a period of two years. He lived to the age of 43 years, 6 months and 23 days and performed every public and private duty with an honest purpose. He entered the foundry department at The Minster Machine company's plant when a young man and worked at that place until sixteen years ago when he accepted a position with Mr. Theo. Kempker who was operating a hardware store in this village. He continued to serve at that place while Mr. Kempker owned the business and later worked for his successors, the Hoying-Westerhelds hardware company, for a period of two years. He retired from the place on account of deli-cate health and was idle for a period. After a time he engaged himself with Mr. Frank Brinkman who is the owner of a pool room and restuffant and he was employed there when his health again forced him to quit work of any kind.

The deceased was married to

Miss Carrie Kempker on June 27, 1911, and she is left to contem-plate the loss. There is also one daughter Cornelia who is seventeen years of age and a son Ray-mond who is thirteen years of age. Mr. Knoxtman was a member
