Solemn requiem high mass was sung in St. Augustine's church Wednesday morning for Mrs. Eleanora Brandewie, aged 81 years and 10 months, who died Sunday at 9 a. m. in Wilson hospital at Sidney from a heart ailment.

Rev. Otto Mueller, the pastor, was celebrant of the mass. Assisting him were the Rev. Warren Hook of St. Patrick's and the Rev. Francis Lutner of Sidney Holy Angels parish. Burial was made in the church cemetery.

Mrs. Brandewie, who had been in failing health some time, had been ill nine days and was a patient at the hospital during that time. She had been residing with a daughter, Mrs. Roy (Blanche) Kipstine, at Sidney.

A resident of Minster nearly 65 years, Mrs. Brandewie was a native of Cairo, Ill. She was born July 11, 1865, the daughter of Timothy and Mary McNamara Minehan.

Her marriage to John Brandewie, Sr., took place in Minster Nov. 27, 1885 and he died Aug. 1, 1942. Mrs. Brandewie came here at the age of 16 and attended St. Mary's convent school for girls.

Surviving are five children, Mrs. Bernard Hiechster, Celina;

Mrs. Harry (Ida) Brickman, Minster; Mrs. Kipstine at Sidney; Mrs. Clark (Hedwig) Hancich and Stanley Brandewie, Wapakoneta. Two sons preceded her in death, Oscar in 1896 here, and Arthur in 1932 in Covington, Ky.

There are four grandchildren, John and Robert Brinkman, Minster; Mary Eleanor Kipstine, Sidney; and Jerry Brandewie, Covington, Ky. Mrs. Rose Fletcher, Memphis, Tenn., is a sister.

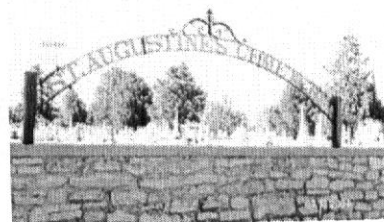
