ALMOST ATTAINED AN OCTOGENARIAN AGE WHEN DEATH RELEASED

HER 6/26/1916

Three Sons And Three Daughters Survive A Loving And Dutiful Mother

Mrs. Catherine Paul, relict of the late Jacob Paul, was taken in death Monday evening at 7:30 at the home of her son-in-law and daughter, Mr, and Mrs. Martin Knost, South Washington street. Mrs. Paul had been in indifferent health for a number of menths past, her final ailment developed dropay and when death o'ertook her she had attained the near octogenarian age of 79 years, 6 months and 6 days.

Mrs. Paul, nee Catherine Purpus was a native of Lauterecken, Bavaria, Germany. Here she was born on December 20, 1836. At the, age of 24 she emigrated to America and was united in marriage soon there-after to Jucob Paul. They secured possession of a fine farm 3 miles west of Botkins, where the couple toited at agricultural pursuits for many years. When evidences of old age began making their inroads, Mr. and Mrs. Paul removed to New Bramen. They resided for a number of years is what is now the Dr. Schmidt property, corner Walnut and Monroe streets. Being desirous, however, of living ineclose proximity to their children, they removed to Batkins, where the husband preceded his wife in death, six years ago. Since then the widow lived alternately with her children living at various points in Auglaize and Shelby counties. Of late, however, she had been making her home with her daughter, Mrs Knost, at whose hands she received loving and tender care. Of late, her cyceight became impaired to such an extent that she was almost blind.

During the years of their married life, Mr. and Mrs. Faul became the parents of seven children, six of whom are still among the living; these are: Ed and Jacob Paul, who reside in Botkins; Louis, who lives on the parental farm; Mrs. Martin Knost of here, Mrs. Chgs. Eritz, 5 miles scytheast of New Bremen and Mrs. Ed Millette of Wapakoneta. She is also survived by one brother. Theodere Purpus of here, and three sisters, Mrs. John Gemmer, of Bippus, Ind.; Mrs. Herman Laut of here and Mrs. Susanna Fegert, who is three years her senior and lives in Germany.


