Lacking two months of having attained his 102 birthday, Auglaize county's oldest resident, Theodore L. Purpus, died at 11:30 o'clock Monday night at his home 16 South Franklin street, New Bremen. He was 101 years nine

months and 26 days of age.

Mr. Purpus had been suffering with the infirmities of age but had been no worse than usual un-til shortly before his passing. He had been in unusually good health for one of his years and until the last few years had been very active, regularly going to his insurance office for a part of every day.

Born in the village of Lauterecken in Rhenisch Bayaria on November 6, 1844, as the son of the late Louis and Louise Kohl Purpus, the centenarian had come to the United States in 1886. He came with two brothers, Louis and Edward, and he lived for a short while in New York City before coming to New Bremen.

On July 22, 1869, he married Antoinette Voeckell who preceded him in death years agothem were born three daughters and five sons. Three sons surviving are Adolph, Indianapolis; Otto, Dayton, and Leo Purpus, New Bremen. In addition to his sons he is survived by eight grandchildren and several greatgrandchildren.

The late Mrs. G. A. Cliberg of St. Marys, was a daughter of the deceased.

Mr. Purpus was one of the orand rurpus was one of the or-ganizers and until its dissolution was the secretary of the Concor-dia Building and Savings Asso-ciation. For 22 years he publish-ed and edited the Stern des Westlichen Ohio and for a long term of years he was clerk of the board of education and insting of board of education and justice of the peace of German township beside conducting an insurance business

The funeral services are being conducted, this afternoon at the late residence by Rev. J. C. Melchert, and burlal will be in the German Protestant cemetery of which for many years the decedent was the secretary.


