Her death was preceded by an illness that was prolonged over several weeks and the members of her family were prepared to accept the death messenger for many days. She was born in this city and every important incident in connection with her life's affairs had relationship with the social and religious orders here, although she and her parents resided in a distant state for a short period.

She was the relict of the late John Sautman, who also spent many years as a resident here. He passed away at the home where his widow died on last Saturday on May 22, 1934. While in the active pursuits of his life he was connected with the livery business in Minster and during other periods was engaged in the farming business. He had passed by middle life before he reached the end of his career and besides his wife and his children left a large circle of friends who had been his associates in the civic affairs of the community.

Mrs. Sautman was born in this city on October 28, 1866, as the daughter of Frank Puthoff and Elizabeth Frausman. Puthoff and the parents were residing in a residence not far from her late home at that time. Both Mr. and Mrs. Puthoff were born in Germany but they came to this country at a very early day in their lives. During the period of Mrs. Sautman's girlhood the family left this city and moved to the state of Arkansas, but they did not remain in that state long. They returned to Ohio and re-established their home in Minster before the subject of this narrative began her common school training.

She began her school work here and her education was received in the schools that were maintained in this city.

Her marriage to Mr. Sautman took place in this city on November 21, 1888, and they established their home in the residence where Mr. Sautman had been born and subsequently where they spent the whole of their marital life. Four children were born into their household and two of these persons survive the mother. They are Mrs. Richard Ahrens and Alfred Sautman, both residents in this city. Two sons died in infancy.




