John Sautman

John J. Sautman, who had lived in Minster over a period of more than three score of years, died at his family home on South Main street on Tuesday morning after a illness of about one week. The man had many vocational connections while he resided among the people in this community and he had a wide circle of acquaintances. He was strictly a Minster product in that he was born in this city and continued to live here through all of the varying periods of his life. His family, too, maintain their homes in this city.

Mr. Sautman was in robust health up to the time of his final illness and among other duties to which he gave attention was the care of his invalid wife. Mrs. Sautman has been suffering with rheumatism for considerable time and her physical condition was always more precarious than that of her husband. The death of Mr. Sautman has had a depressing effect on his wife.

The relatives of the deceased agreed the fact that Mr. Sautman only lived in one civic center during his entire life, but he also resided at one site during that time. He was born in a residence on South Main street on June 22, 1865 and during all of his succeeding years he maintained a home here. Immediately following his marriage he and his young bride established their home there and were pending their declining years together at the site when death intervened to separate them.

Mr. Sautman lived to the age of sixty-eight years and eleven months and he was a busy man during the most of his active life. Although he maintained a home within the city limits he did farming to some extent. He was always prepared to do this line of work and his services were of considerable consequence to land owners who had fields to be rented or

planted. During an earlier period and for the livery business was a necessary adjunct to the commercial affairs of any city or village. Mr. Sautman owned and operated a livery stable in this city. His first venture in this line was at the site where the Robert Amun company's store is now located and later he operated a business at the site where the L. Fischer variety store is now located.

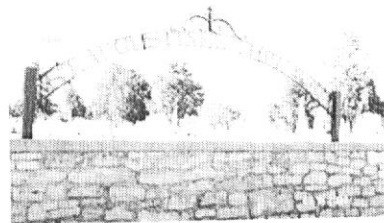
At a time when he was employed long certain periods by Cooper's companies and he had diverse other connections.

The deceased was a son of Joseph and Josephine Sautman who were both born in Germany but he came to this country during his early years. He was a member of a family of four children and he was the second member of this family to pass away. Two sons, Mr. Bernard Bornhorst, of Minster, and Mrs. Fred Lang, of Lima, survive, while Mrs. Anna Rose, another sister, died at about several years ago.

Mr. Sautman was united in marriage to Miss Rose Puthoff in the month of November, 1888, and they became the parents of four children, two of whom are living, a daughter and son who are in Richard Ahrens and Alfred Ahrens, both living at Minster. A son passed away while young. There are three grandchildren.

Mr. Sautman was a member of the St. Augustine Catholic church and he was also identified with the following organizations: St. Augustine Orphans society, St. Bonaventure Benevolent society and Minster Fraternity Order of Eagles. The funeral was announced for Tuesday morning at the St. Augustine church.
