Surviving with his wife of 59 years, the former Antoinette Streaker of Maria Stein, are four sons, Kenneth (Richard of Sidney, William (Elizabeth of Cincinnati), John (Dorothy of Columbus and James (Patricia of Brookfield, Mo., two daughters, Joyce (Richard), Shirley (Hortelville, Mich. and Sharon (John) Rittenhouse, Plymouth, Mich. Two brothers, Herb (Verly of Versailles and Elmer (Carole of Sidney, three sisters, Delores (Robert) Fether, Russia, Verma (Jiggs) Thiede, Maria Stein, and Mariene (Joseph) Chusley, Sidney. Funeral Mass is 10:30 a.m. Wednesday at the church. Burial will follow at Graceland Cemetery.

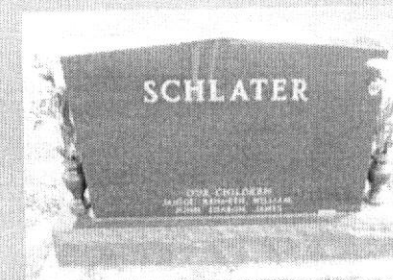
