## Henry Sommer

Henry Sommer, aged 79, a life-long resident of this community, died at 4:40 a. m. last Saturday in the home of a son-in-law and daughter, Mr. and Mrs. Alvin Maier, in Ft. Loramie. He had been ill six weeks and confined to bed two weeks.

Funeral services were conducted in St. Michael's church in Ft. Loramie at 9:30 a. m. Wednesday. Requiem high mass was celebrated by the Rev. Paul J. Rattermann. Burial was made in the church cemetery. Arrangements were in charge of the Hogenkamp funeral home.

Mr. Sommer was a native of Minster. He was born March 10, 1873, son of Henry and Anna Schilmoeller Sommer. His wife, the former Mary B. Fleckenstein, whom he married June 5, 1901, died Nov. 9, 1943.

After the death of his wife Mrs. Sommer left his farm, located one mile north of Ft. Loramie along State Route 68, and lived with his children up to the time of his death.

Survivors include a son, Aloysius Sommer, of Kettlersville; six daughters, Mrs. Irene Siegel of Newport, Mrs. Alfrieda Siegel of Ft. Loramie, Mrs. Clara Fader of Dayton, Mrs. Wilhelmina Maier and Mrs. Florentine Barhorst of Ft. Loramie, and Mrs. Mary Brucken of Dayton; 29 grandchildren and two great grandchildren; a brother, Frank Sommer, Minster, and four sisters, Mrs. Mary Sanders of Ft. Loramie, Bernadine Sommer and Mrs. Elizabeth Eilerman of St. Patrick, and Mrs. Rosa Schmiesing of Minster.

Mr. Sommer was a member of the St. Joseph Men's society of St. Michael's church.
