

Miss Agnes Vanderhorst
Miss Agnes Vanderhorst, who
was born and reared in Minster,
died at the home of Mr. and Mrs.
Clem Franzier, 136 Dover street,
Dayton, on last Tuesday morning,
July 9, 1935. The body will be
brought to Minster on Friday
morning by N. J. Hogenkamp &
Son, funeral directors and the interment will be made in St. Augustine cemetery, following funeral time cemetery, following funeral services at the church here. Miss Vanderhorst left this vil-

Miss Vanderhorst left this village approximately ten years ago and since that time had made her home with Mr. and Mrs. Franzier, the latter being a niece.

She was born at this place in the year of 1865, and lived to the age of 70 years, 3 months and 12 days. Her father was Peter Vanderhorst and her mother was Mary Tangeman Vanderhorst and the latter spent all of her life in the Minster community. The father was born in Holland, but he came to America during his early life and lived among the people here over a long period. They spent their marital life as residents in this locality and at the end of their earthly careers their-bodies were laid to rest in the local cemetery.

The subject of this narrative maintained a home in Minster for several years following the death of her parents and made a change only when conditions made such a move almost processor. Their move almost necessary. During the time when she made her home

in Dayton she kept in touch with relatives and former friends in this city and the movement to bring her remains to this place for interment was in keeping with her expressed sentiments.

She was a manhor of familiary in the control of the contro

She was a member of a family of nine children and was the fifth one of this number to pass beyond the border line. Three sisters and one brother are deceased while one sister and three brothers surone sister and three brothers survivo. The surviving members of the family are: John Vanderhorst who resides on a farm two miles east of Minster; Henry and Bernard Vanderhorst who are living in this city; Mrs. Elizabeth Ungruhn, who is the only living sister, is a resident at Cincinnati.

The deceased sisters and brother are: Wm. Vanderborst, Mrs. Mary Schuler, Mrs. Margaret Massing, who met a tragic death at her home in the northern section of Minster

who met a tragic death at her home in the northern section of Minster in the year of 1921; another sister Anna left this locality a number of years ago and was absent almost continuously thereafter.

She was a member of the St. Rose sodality of the St. Augustine congregation:
