Henry Vanderhorst, aged 70, lifelong Minster resident, died suddenly in his home on Franklin street early last Friday, and funeral services were conducted in St. Augustine's church here Monday at 9 a. m. Interment was made in the parish cemetery.

Mr. Vanderhorst's passing was entirely unexpected. Seemingly in the best of health, he had visited the Minster business district the evening before. He suffered a heart attack early Friday morning, however, and death followed swiftly, at 5:45 a. m.

Born here on April 4, 1869, he was a son of the late Peter and Mary (Tangeman) Vanderhorst. His father came to Minster from Holland, and his mother was a native here. He married Elizabeth (Weghorst) Vanderhorst on Feb. 2, 1922. She survives, as do two brothers, John and Ben Vanderhorst, of Minster. One brother and five sisters preceded him in death.

Mr. Vanderhorst, who enjoyed a wide acquaintanceship and was favorably known in this community, had worked as a ditcher for a long period prior to his retirement several years ago. He was a lifelong member of the Catholic church and of the local parish.

Rev. Francis Rehberger officiated at the services Monday. The pallbearers were William Massing, Leonard Massing, John Vanderhorst, Lawrence Vanderhorst, Donald Vanderhorst and Roy Schuler.
