Pastoral services for Joseph H. Wieman, aged 71, a native of Minster, who died at his home on East Spring street at St. Mary's at midnight Tuesday, have been arranged for Friday at 9 a. m. in the Holy Rosary church in his home city. Rev. Gaswin B. Menge will officiate. After the church service, the funeral cortege will proceed to Minster, and interment will be made in the St. Augustine cemetery here.

Paralysis, with which he had been seriously ill for a week preceding his passing, was responsible for the death of Mr. Wieman. He had been in ill health for the past four years, and was obliged to retire from active work four years ago, due to an illness which affected his eyesight.

Mr. Wieman was a charter member of the Eagles lodge at St. Mary's and was a past worthy president of the order. As one of the first members of the order he had always been interested in the organization and in its growth.

He was born here on May 21, 1880, a son of Ferdinand and Mary Wieman, both of whom are dead. His mother's death occurred at his home about two years ago.

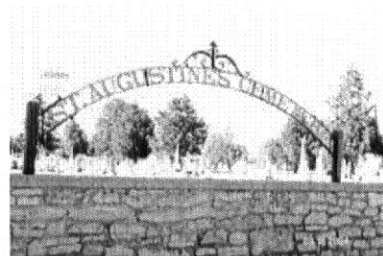

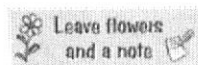
