Mr. Ahrns, lifelong Minster resident and a former businessman, died unexpectedly of a heart attack . Sunday night at the Joint Township Memorial Hospital in St. Marys where he had been a resident for five days.

Lewis C. Ahrns Dies: Former Businessman

Lewis C. Ahrns, agod 61, lifelong resident and a former businessman, died unexportedly at the Joint Township Memorial Hospital in St. Marys at 8:50 p. m. Sunday. Mr. Ahrns apparently was recovering satisfactorily from his illness when the end came suddenty. Death was attributed to a heart attack. He was hospitalized five days.
