## LEWIS C. AHRNS

MINSTER — A solemn requiem high mass will be sung at 9 a.m. Thursday in St. Augustine's Church for Lewis C. Ahrns, 61, Minster, with Rev. William Meyer officiating. Burial will be in the church cemetery.

Mr. Ahrns, lifelong Minster resident and a former businessman, died unexpectedly of a heart attack Sunday night at the Joint Township Memorial Hospital in St. Marys where he had been a resident for five days.

He was meat department employee at the Farno Brothers store for several years up to his illness. Prior to that, for seven years, he owned and operated a food market in the former Meyer Block on West Fourth St.

Survivors include his wife, Mary, whom he married in 1923; three sons Alton Ahrns at home, William Ahrns of Dayton, and David Ahrns of Ft. Knox, Ky.; three daughters, Mrs. Alfred Hancock of Norfolk, Va., Mrs. Mack McConnell of Troy, and Mrs. Norman Leiss of Minster; 12 grandchildren; three brothers, William Ahrns of Deshler, Charles Ahrns of Minster, and Richard Ahrns of Minster; two sisters Mrs. Mayme Farno, of Minster and Mrs. Waldo Kester of Dayton.

He was a member of the St. Augustine Catholic Church and the Holy Name Society of the church, and held membership in the Eagles Lodge and the Knights of St. John.

## Lewis C. Ahrns Dies; Former Businessman

Lewis C. Ahrns, aged 61, lifelong resident and a former businessman, died unexpectedly at the Joint Township Memorial Hospital in St. Marys at 8:50 p. m. Sunday. Mr. Ahrns apparently was recovering satisfactorily from his illness when the end came suddenly. Death was attributed to a heart attack. He was hospitalized five days.

Mr. Ahrns was employed as a clerk in the meat department at the Farno Brothers Store for several years up to the time of his illness. He was a former employe of the Minster Machine Company. A number of years ago, for seven years, he owned and operated his own food market in the former Meyer Block on West Fourth Street.

He was a member all his life of the St. Augustine Church, and was a member of the Holy Name Society of the church. He held membership also in the Eagles Lodge and the Knights of St. John.

Born July 12, 1899 he was a son of John B. and Anna Kline Ahrns. He and Mary Ronan were married Sept. 3, 1923. She survives with three sons, Alton at home, William of Dayton and David at Ft. Knox, Ky.; three daughters, Mrs. Alfred (Lois) Hancock of Norfolk, Va., Mrs. Mack (Virginia) McConnell of Troy, and Mrs. Norman (Alice) Leiss of Minster. There are 12 grandchildren.

Also surviving are three brothers, William of Deehler, and Charles and Richard, both of Minster, and two sisters, Mrs. Mayme Farno of Minster and Mrs. Waldo Kester of Dayton. He was preceded in death of a son, a sister, and four brothers.

Services were arranged for 9 a. m. Thursday in St. Augustine's Church, with the Rev. William Meyer as celebrant of the Solemn Requiem High Mass, and with burial in the church cemetery.
