The Reverend was elected as the first provincial secretary of the Province of the Pacific in 1965 and later served a second term in that position beginning in 1984. During that time, he was the editor of tyeh

provinvce's newsletter and its archivist.

In 1990, he retired to St. Charles Center. He remained a man of faith until his final days, even making himself available to minister to his fellow priests and brothers and was often called upon to administer the anointing of the sick when they fell ill.

Gamble is survived by a sister and brother-in-law, Ted and Molly Teckman of Sheffield; five nieces and two nephews, including Tom Teckman of St. Marys, who took care of his affairs in his later years, and numerous great-nieces and great-nephews.

A brother, Richard and his wife, Gertrude, pre-

cede him.
