

Raymond J Kahlig

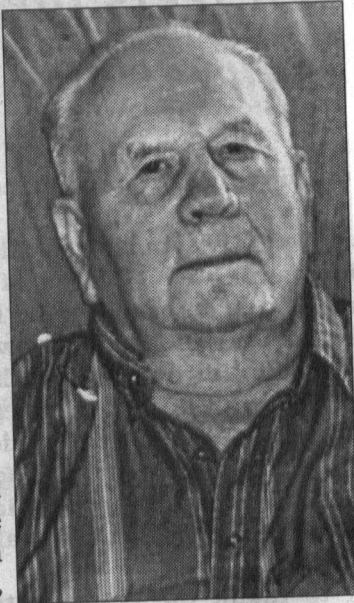
Raymond J Kahlig, 81, of Coldwater, died Monday, Nov. 7, 2005, at his residence.
