

## Lionel H. Krieg

Lionel H. Krieg, 78, of New Bremen, died on Saturday, Sept. 17, 2005, at Joint Township District Memorial Hospital in St. Marys.

He was born on Jan. 19, 1927, at Jay County, Indiana, the son of Sebastian and Mary (Laux) Krieg. On January 31, 1948, he married Ruth Hummel, who survives.
