years, who died in the home of a daughter, Mrs. Delia Ostendorf, in Fort Jennings, Putnam county, last Saturday afternoon. Mrs. Loy, who had been residing with her children for a number of years, had spent three months with Mrs. Ostendorf and was taken ill with complications two months before her ceath. 
