The Rev. Joseph Pax

The Rev. Joseph Pax, C.PP.S., 85, of St. Charles Center in Carthagena, died April 14, 2007, at Kindred Hospital, in Dayton, of injuries sustained in a traffic accident on Jan. 8, 2007.



He was born June 18, 1921, in Celina, a son of Leo and Gertrude (Jenniges) Pax, and they preceded him in death.

He is survived by two sisters, Lucille Bub of San Diego, Calif., Trudy Pak of Sauk Center, Minn.; two brothers, Robert (Dorothy) Pax of St. Henry, Ralph (Mary) Pax of

In 1983, he became pastor of St. Rose Church in St. Rose, and in 1987, moved to St. Henry where he was named pastor of St. Henry Church until 1994, when he became a chaplain for the Sisters of the Most Precious Blood in Dayton. He retired to St. Charles Center in Carthagena in 2001.
