

## **Myrle J. Peoppelman**

Myrle J. Peoppelman, 64, Coble Rd., Yorkshire died on Monday, Nov. 13, 2006 at home in the late afternoon. Death was due to natural causes after a sudden illness.

He was born on July 1, 1942, in Celina to Mercedes M. Luttmer and Lawrence F. Poeppelman who survive in Maria Stein.

He was a Senior Metalworking Sales Engineer for Kennametal, Inc., of Latrobe, Pa. for many years. Myrle was also the clerk for Poeppelman's Auctioneering Service.

Myrle enjoyed antique tractor shows and tractor pulls, snow mobiling and visiting flea markets.

A Mass of Christian burial was on Friday, Nov. 17 at St. Nicholas Catholic Church, Osgood with Rev. David L. Zink officiating. Burial followed at St. Martin's Cemetery in Osgood.
